

List of airlines operating commercial flights out of Thailand

Travel restrictions:

Foreign nationals are not allowed to enter or transit in Thailand EXCEPT for diplomats, those with a Thai work permit, crew, or otherwise permitted by the PM. Those allowed must have a 'fit to fly' certificate. See [Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand](#) or [International Air Transport Association website](#).

Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand (CAAT) has issued an order banning **inbound** (i.e into Thailand) passenger planes until 23:59 on 31 May with some exceptions. **This is not affecting most outbound (i.e. leaving Thailand) commercial flights.**

Cathay Pacific	Transit restrictions. Effective from 25 March 2020 (00:00 HKT.) From 00:00 on 25 March, all transiting through Hong Kong International Airport will be suspended.
Emirates	The UAE government suspended all flights as of 25 March.
Etihad	The UAE government suspended all flights as of 25 March.
Eurowings	Stopped flights as of 29 March
Finnair	Stopped flights as of 1 April.
Norwegian	Stopped flights from Bangkok and Krabi.
Oman Air	Temporarily suspended as of 29 March
Singapore	Short-term visitors not allowed to visit or transit through Singapore from 11.59pm on 23 March
